Leaflet of the German Clay and Clay Mineral Group e.V. on information requirements according to Articles 13 and 14 GDPR

According to Articles 13 and 14 EU GDPR, the controller must provide a data subject whose data it processes with the information specified in the Articles. This leaflet fulfills this obligation to provide information.

2. Contact details of the data protection officer(s):

Since fewer than 10 persons are entrusted with the processing of personal data in the association, the obligation to appoint a data protection officer does not apply. The duty to provide information is exercised by the Executive Board.

3. Purposes for which personal data are processed:

The personal data is processed for the execution of the membership relationship (e.g. invitation to meetings, collection of contributions, organization of conferences and workshops, dispatch of newsletters).

Furthermore, personal data is forwarded to third parties:

- *for the reconciliation of claims for reduced conference fees to the umbrella organizations (AIPEA, ECGA) and to the respective organizers of the Mid-European Clay Conference*
- *for the matching of mailing addresses for the communication organ GMIT to the Arbeitsgemeinschaft Geowissenschaftliche Mitteilungen*
- *Verification of access rights of subscribers to the journal Clay Minerals to the Mineralogical Society of Great Britain.*

In addition, personal data in connection with scientific events, including reporting on them, will be published on the website of the association as well as on the pages of the umbrella associations and transmitted to local, regional and national print media.

4. Legal basis on which the processing is carried out:

The processing of personal data is carried out on the basis of necessity for the performance of a contract pursuant to Article 6 (1) (b) GDPR. The contractual relationship is primarily the membership relationship in the

Deutsche Ton- und Tonmineralgruppe e.V. and to participate in the scientific exchange of information in the umbrella organizations AIPEA and ECGA (purposes of the association according to § 2 of the statutes of DTTG).

If personal data are collected without the processing being necessary for the fulfillment of the purpose of the association, the processing is based on consent pursuant to Article 6 (1) a) in conjunction with Article 7 GDPR. Article 7 GDPR.

The publication of personal data on the Internet or in local, regional or national print media is done to protect the legitimate interests of the association (see Article 6 (1) f) GDPR). The legitimate interest of the association is to inform the public by reporting on the activities of the association. In this context, personal data including pictures of the participants will be published, for example, in the context of reporting on scientific conferences and events of the association.

5. The recipients or categories of recipient of the personal data:

Personal data of the members are only passed on to umbrella organizations (AIPEA, ECGA, MECC) and to the senders of journals subscribed by the members (Arbeitsgemeinschaft GMIT, Mineralogical Society of Great Britain and Ireland).

The data of the bank details of the members will be forwarded to the account keeping bank of the DTTG (currently Sparkasse Hannover) for the purpose of collecting the membership fee.

6. The duration for which the personal data will be stored or, if this is not possible, the criteria for determining the duration:

The personal data will be stored for the duration of the membership. Upon termination of membership, the data categories are retained for a further ten years in accordance with the statutory retention periods and then deleted. In the period between termination of membership and deletion, the processing of these data is restricted.

Certain categories of data are stored in the association archive for the purpose of the association chronicle. These are the categories of first name, last name, date of entry and exit, honors or events in which the person concerned has participated. The names of members in meeting minutes or media contributions are also stored permanently. The storage is based on a legitimate interest of the association in the contemporary historical documentation of the association and in the documentation of scientific developments.

All data of the other categories (e.g. bank data, address, contact data) will be deleted with the termination of the membership, contact data will be removed from the distribution lists of the association.

7. The data subject shall be entitled to the following rights under the conditions set forth in each of the Articles:

- The right to information according to Article 15 GDPR,*
- The right to rectification according to Article 16 GDPR,*
- The right to deletion according to Article 17 GDPR,*

- *The right to restriction of processing according to Article 18 GDPR,*
- *The right to data portability according to Article 20 GDPR,*
- *The right to object according to Article 21 GDPR,*
- *The right to complain to a supervisory authority according to Article 77 GDPR*
- *The right to revoke consent at any time without affecting the lawfulness of the processing carried out on the basis of the consent until the revocation.*

8. The source from which the personal data originate:

*Personal data is generally collected as part of the acquisition of membership.
Additional information on honors or participation in association events is collected as part of membership.*
